The only thing that is unchanging is change itself. The one absolute constant is everything is constantly changing. There is no other time in my lifetime that I have had more adjustments, alterations and adjustments than my experiences in 2020. We have been facing challenges, not just for a season but for the whole year. We may see things

change permanently because of the upheaval of covid-19, economic struggles, political shifting, social injustice and a number of other things that have trampled on our concept of normal.



Pastoral shifts: The first change I experienced is I assumed the Interim Regional Director for CB North Central (now called Venture Church Network Midwest) after our existing Director abdicated the role early December 2019. For those who are unaware, Oak Grove Church is connected to a region of churches that are firmly connected to being gospel centered, grace driven and mission focused. This includes about 100 churches who are learning to stand shoulder to shoulder to serve the Lord. While much of last year seemed like triage, the Regional Board invited me to take on the role of Regional Director on a permanent basis back in May 2020. Believing this was exactly how the Lord had positioned me, I accepted the role with the support of our Elders. This simply means that on top of being a full time pastor I am working with these other churches to encourage them to take their next bold step of faith for the sake of the gospel.

The **Elders** have had our challenges trying to navigate the ever-changing circumstances of closing down ministries, opening up ministries, closing programs, restarting, keeping up with social distancing, shepherding those who are unable to come, catching up to those who have continued to come, carrying out ministry without the structural supports of our programs, developing patience and learning about grace. This has felt nothing short of impossible at times and even our best efforts seem to fall short. We have lost some loved ones to sickness and health. We had some families simply disappear by finding

new occupations in the every shifting landscape of employment. We hardly had a chance to say goodbye much less give people an appropriate send off. We have struggled with "what to do next" and "what do we actually plan for". Covid-19 altered life significantly. While our opinions about the cause, threat, and communication of this virus was always confusing it became apparent that while this virus did not pose a threat to everyone, it was a serious threat to others. There seemed to be no rhyme or reason for who would be affected by this virus and that left everyone more uneasy than normal. We have been praying for a number of people who contracted the virus, had to quarantine, and those who have ended up in the hospital. While we struggle with our helplessness, it has driven us to rely in much greater ways on the Lord's help.

The tension in our **culture** has put pressure on the Body of Christ that in the face of divergent value systems and personal convictions even in the Body of Christ, we have been so impressed by the godliness of our faith community. There are some nightmare stories out there in the world on how Christians have behaved badly, but our Body has been outstanding. The Body of Christ at Oak Grove Church has been a great encouragement to the leaders and we continue to pray that our attempts to keep up with a flood of needs has helped encourage you in some fashion.

The **ministry leaders** of this Body have been learning creative ways to shepherd people from a whole new posture. We are learning a better version of servanthood. We are learning that disciplemaking relies more on relationships than programs and structures. We are learning how important it is to know our own spiritual journey and be able to help encourage others in their spiritual mapping. We are learning to adapt, adjust, and creatively reach out to those around us.



Our worship and tech teams led by Josh and his tech crew did a marvelous job bringing us up to speed on livestreaming our services. We have discovered in wonderful ways how the Spirit of God has gifted so many of you and given you such a servant's heart to step up and invest in helping us serve the greater Body of Christ. The heart of our volunteers has been an amazing strength that has invigorated our Body and cultivated a deep appreciation to the Lord for His generosity to us as his



children. We are now better equipped to serve those who are unable to be here and those who we have now touched who do not even live here. The Lord has expanded our reach and we hope to continue to pursue His leading in all these things.



I must say that I have been very proud of the Body at Oak Grove church. I know that many came down in different places in how they understood and interpreted the fog of information that overwhelmed our normal perspective of life. We all had to refocus from a vantage point was very unfamiliar to us. These extenuating circumstances put a tremendous amount of pressure on everyone, even to a breaking point in some cases. Everyone has found it hard to translate all these changes into the context of our own life. That being said, I am so proud of the

believers here at Oak Grove who've done an outstanding job of treating each other with respect and walking alongside of others with the humble attitude that considers the other person better than themselves. We choose to value the gospel and people above our circumstances and it was a testament to His grace.

Staffing has been our hardest and most painful change at the end of our calendar year. In the midst of some painful situations, we are moving around Josh and his family with love and grace, helping to chart a pathway of healing, forgiveness, and restoration. We have had weekly meetings, providing support and resources to chart this pathway with grace. Keep on praying for them and all of us as we seek to navigate these times where the spiritual battle has intensified and calls for all of us to be spiritually sharp and alert to stay fixed on a gospel centered life.

New Changes: In all these transitions we have been encouraged to find new faces exploring what we do here at Oak Grove Church. We have seen many new people wander in the door and have been energized when they experience the warmth of our Body extending a hand of fellowship and worshipping together in house and online. We have heard great comments that we are singularly focused on the gospel and speaking into real issues in our culture.

Our worship teams, especially Shannon Dane, Ele, and Rick have stepped up to take on roles to bring us through the end of the year so that we have a trajectory that supports our teams and has given us more opportunity to utilize the gifts and skills of those in our Body. Our entire worship team, sound techs, livestream people, etc. are outstanding and have been very flexible.



We are also in the process of exploring **church planting** and taking steps to strategically begin this movement to reach generations of people and to be a church that is bearing fruit, not just by reproducing believers but reproducing gospel-centered churches. This will be methodical and yet intentional. We are now taking our next bold steps of faith and when we stay focused on Christ we have every reason to have confident hope in the mission of the King. With much gratitude and thanksgiving may we continue to run with endurance the race that has been set before us.



Our ministry exists to make Christ known to children so that they, in turn, will impact the world around them for Jesus Christ. We exist to bring glory to God in everything we do.



2. We were still able to hold Grove Kids **Fun Feet Soccer Camp** on the fields at King of Grace Church/School the week of July 12-16.



Financial Statements Summary

OGC on December 31, 2020 had \$128,146 in assets of which \$51,338 is a COVID Paycheck Protection Program loan that will be returned to the federal government during first quarter 2021 leaving a year-end cash balance of \$76,808. Current liabilities are \$8,832 for payables due in January 2021. Offerings exceeded expenditures by \$30,822 which is the largest net operating in recent memory.

We praise God for the faithfulness of Oak Grove Church in both giving generously and carefully managing expenses throughout the year.

Trustee Activities Summary

- Managing finances throughout the year.
- Negotiating and securing a lease with Nicole Ecole Charter School.
- Spring and Fall workdays to remove rubbish from inside the building and improve grounds around the building.
- Updating room 107 and creating a family restroom.
- Replacing Lois Sheppard who retired as janitor.
- Resurfacing parking lot entrances and exits.
- Upgrading security by installing a new camera security system throughout the building and parking lot.
- Upgrading lighting in hallways, kitchen, room 107, and the children's large room with LED bubs.
- Maintaining all building systems including HVAC, electrical, plumbing and communications.
